Translation, an Example (Part three of four)

A central message of Jesus, is the importance of forgiveness. All around us there are those who struggle with the things they have done, or the things done to them. Whether one is the perpetrator or the victim, what happened isn't right, we know it isn't right and yet, if we don't find a way to move forward, it can consume us.

We forgive others, not just to free them, but more importantly, to free ourselves. In the Church we address this with language that can seem foreign to those in the secular community. For instance, in the Book of Common Prayer we read that Jesus, "by his one oblation of himself once offered, a full, perfect, and sufficient sacrifice, oblation, and satisfaction, for the sins of the whole world". That is not language that resonates in the secular community, nor is it necessarily understood in the spiritual intertidal zone.

However, in the conversation between Peter and Jesus on the beach, over a breakfast of fish, after the resurrection we see forgiveness in practice. Peter, having told Jesus he would never leave him, denied knowing him three times. Now they are together again. Jesus asks Peter thrice if he loves him. Each time Peter says yes, and each time Jesus tells Peter to care for his followers.

Jesus establishes that Peter doesn't have to be defined by the last bad thing that happened. Peter can be defined by the next good thing that will happen. That is true for each of us.

It is a message in language that can be understood in the intertidal zone; a message that can be understood by those who did not grow up in the church.
