Diakonia is for all of us (Part four of four)

In his work, <u>Diakonia</u>, John N. Collins explores the linguistic and theological history of the word, "Diakonia" as well as its use in the early church. It is a word used (incorrectly in Collins' view) to describe the ministry of a deacon, and to describe that ministry as acts of charity.

Collins recounts the words of Edwin Hatch, an Anglican Priest who presented a series of lectures at Oxford in the late 1800s, on the organization of the early Christian Church. Hatch said, "To you and me and men like ourselves is committed, in these anxious days, that which is at once an awful responsibility and a splendid destiny - to transform this modern world into a Christian society...".

Transformation of the world around us is our mission. That is diakonia. It is the work of all of us. We are all called present the gospel of Jesus to those around us and to do so in a form that is understandable. We are all called to love those around us as ourselves. The message of Jesus isn't in Aramaic, or Greek, or English as understood in the 1600s or as it is understood today. That message, of healing, reconciliation and forgiveness, is a message not of the tongue, but of the heart.

Sometimes our actions translate that message far better than our words might.

That is Diakonia. It is the work of the baptized, the work of all of us.

A Deacon is merely, and simply, a servant of the Bishop.
