The Liturgy Committee is a very important committee in this parish. It exists for the purpose of encouraging worship that will serve the needs of the whole congregation, under whatever circumstances we gather. We reviewed our worship for the past season of Lent and Easter Sunday. There was great appreciation for the Palm Sunday Blessing of Crosses and the drive-by opportunity to receive the Cross and a blessing. Much gratitude for the music ministry of Georgia and Kate, and a discussion of whether we should be trying something new. Most felt that keeping it familiar had a lot of value right now. The general consensus is that we are doing the best we can at the moment.

We looked ahead both to the rest of the Easter season and in the longer term. For the Easter season we will continue but we will add the doxology at the end of the service. As soon as the restrictions are lifted to allow it we will plan an opportunity for a Drive-by Communion service.

As we think about the future people feel that there is much that is good in the zoom services and it may be that we will continue to hold some in the future.
