- The last Sunday in June is the Feast of St. Peter and there will be some sort of drive by activity
- Participants were very happy with the music in the Zoom worship and hope it will continue;
- Zoom meetings allow fellowship that would be absent at indoor worship under the necessary Covid restrictions;

PWRDF is responding to an urgent appeal from the newly installed Archbishop of Jerusalem, Hosam Naoum, with funds for Al Ahli Hospital in Gaza, with a grant of \$10,000.
