Dr. Bonnie Henry has re-instated the mask mandate for indoor use; this is something we are already doing. She has also said that we will not be moving into phase 4 on September 7 due to the high numbers of cases. We have not yet heard from the bishop.

Assuming that things do not change we are planning our next inperson service for 10:30 on September 26. The zoom service will take place at 9:30 AM.

At the same time we will be working on learning how to combine our zoom and in-person services using technology. There will be a moderate cost for equipment we don't yet have; anyone who wishes to offer financial support for this is welcome to do so.
