The Labyrinth is not a puzzle, there is only one path to the centre, and one path from the centre back to the entrance.



Advent is coming

On November 28 Advent begins, these are the four Sundays before Christmas.

The first Sunday of Advent is actually the first day of the church year. On this day the lectionary changes over. We will move from year B to year C; in year C we read mostly from Luke's gospel.

Some churches use Purple for Advent, the traditional colour is blue. Advent is a solemn season but not a penitential season. While the world prepares for Christmas, and the many other holidays that occur at this time, the church encourages us to prepare for the coming again of Jesus.

We are urged in the epistles to expect Jesus to come again. Their expectation was that Jesus would return soon—even very soon. But it has been 2000 years, more or less, and we forget to wait. Advent reminds and gives us practice.

This is a good time to think of ways to observe Advent.

The Prayer Chain is offering to collect our prayer requests each Sunday in Advent. They will be offered at the Altar and, if permission is given, will be shared with the Prayer Chain for further prayer during the week.
