Worship Services to Return to the Sanctuary

Last Sunday the Liturgy Committee decided that worship services will return to the church beginning the First Sunday of Advent, November 28.

We need to follow the current COVID protocols:

50% of capacity (maximum 60 people)

Masks worn indoors at all times

No singing

Sign in at the door and sanitize hands.

We are requiring proof of vaccination at the door for any people over 11 years of age (Provincial Vaccination Card). We invite those who are not yet vaccinated to participate in the service by zoom.

Music Changes

The members of the Liturgy Committee have accepted responsibility for returning the books to the pew and we will be using the hymn books during the service. We will be reducing the number of hymns printed in the leaflet. If you attend by zoom and need to borrow a hymn book from the church you are welcome to stop by on Wednesday morning or call the office to ask for one to be brought to you.

During Advent we will be adding another hymn to the list and we will sing some Christmas carols through Advent.

There will be one service on Christmas Eve. Please call or email the office to indicate whether you prefer 4:00 or 7:00.

Preparing for a Return

Saturday, November 27 at 2:00 PM, we will be holding a walk-through rehearsal of the Sunday service. Please plan to attend if you are a reader, an LA, a greeter, or a member of the Liturgy Committee. We will need people to serve as ushers, especially during the Communion distribution process. Please plan to attend and recall how to serve God and the community in this way. A zoom rehearsal will also be taking place and folk can access this using the same link as for the Sunday service.
