Reconciliation—what does it mean for us?

Occasionally this fall and winter we have published some of the 94 Calls to Action from the Truth and Reconciliation Commission Report. This has been done to help us grow in our awareness of our First Nations peoples and our responsibility.

The calls to action are readily available to read as is the progress made toward each: <u>Delivering on Truth and Reconciliation Commission Calls to Action</u> (reaanc-cirnac.gc.ca)

The Anglican Church of Canada has also moved forward with a variety of steps toward reconciliation. We have apologised for residential schools (Archbishop Michael Peers) and for spiritual abuse (Arch bishop Fred Hiltz). We have made archival material available without restriction. We have paid our whole, committed contribution to the settlement. We have established a self-governing Indigenous Church within the Anglican Church of Canada. We have established a healing fund used for many purposes including language restoration programs. We have much to be proud of at the national level. In years to come it will be important to build relationships with local First Nations so we can continue this work.

The parish of St Peter Anglican Church and St Saviour Anglican Church is located on the unceded, traditional territory of the Ligwi'da'xw people: the We Wai Kai, Wei Wai Kum, and Kwiakah First Nations; the unceded traditional territory of the Klahoose First Nation; the unceded traditional territory of the K'omoks First Nation and the unceded traditional territory of the Homalco First Nation.
