It is a multi-unit online programme from a company called Praesidium that can be customized to the ministry(s) you are involved with. If you currently require this training, we will contact you and forward your name to the Diocesan office. You will then receive an e-mail outlining how to register and which units you need to complete. You will have one month to complete these units. When they're done let Andrea Charlton, our new Safe Church Liaison, know and she will finalize with the Diocese. This process is new to all of us so we'll be working our way through it together!

This is the final Sunday in Pride Month so we pray for those among us and those in our parish who are Lesbian, Gay, Bi-sexual, Trans (identify with a different gender than one assigned at birth), 2 Spirited (the preferred term for many Indigenous folks), Queer (many people prefer this term), and questioning (those who are confused or still exploring questions of gender). People in the above categories experience exclusion, violence, and various forms of discrimination and harassment. Some are "out" where we can see and know who they are, some are still "in the closet" and don't willingly share. They need our prayers and our welcome, and they need us to stand with them.
